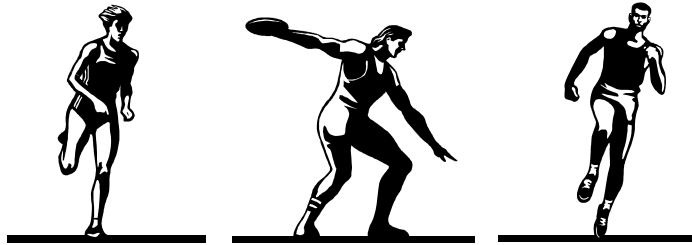

Online Entry procedures for SUB-SECTIONAL or SECTIONAL Qualifying Meets

**Head Coaches bear the ultimate responsibility for making sure that their entries are correct and accurate. A head coach may assign the online entry responsibility to one of their assistants; however, the head coach should be certain to double check the entries submitted before the final deadlines.

HEAD COACHES –

Your first stop should be to go to the TSSAA website at www.tssaa.org . Click on the link for DI and DII Track Post-Season Online Entry Form. Information about the online entry process will be made available on or before March 1st.

If your school competes in a Sub-sectional meet, you will be required to complete your online entries prior to the posted deadline for your Sub-Sectional meet. Advancers to the Section final meet and then the State Championship will be automatic and you will not need to re-enter athletes again. Sub-Sectional online entry will be open starting on April 15th and continue until the final meet entry deadline determined by your meet director.

If your school competes in only a Section final meet, you will be required to complete your online entries prior to the posted deadline for your Section final meet. Advancers to the State Championship will be automatic and you will not need to re-enter athletes again. Sectional online entry will be open starting on April 15th and continue until the final meet entry deadline determined by your meet director.

Online entry in 2012 will use the “Milesplit Online Entry System” – (www.tennessee-runner.com)

While online entry for specific Sub-Sectional and Sectional meets will not open until April 15th, coaches are encouraged to visit the website anytime to “claim your team” and “update your athlete/roster names”. ****Reasons for utilizing online entry & single-provider database preparation**

- Faster State Qualifier list preparation & communication
- Smaller chance for manual mistakes due to human error
- Allows for flexibility of individual meet directors but maintains a state-wide formal process
- Problems are easier to find and the responsible party is identifiable – eliminating “blame-games”

MEET QUALIFYING PROCEDURES:

Sub-Sectional Meet Information

TSSAA needs to know the dates and locations of each Sub-Sectional as soon as possible. These can be sent to Richard McWhirter at rmcwhirter@tssaa.org.

- Placement of teams into certain Sub-Sectional meets has always been handled by the schools. It does not appear on the TSSAA Website. For information regarding the location of the sub-sectional meet that your school traditionally competes, please contact Richard McWhirter at rmcwhirter@tssaa.org.
- Sub-Sectional Meets are considered preliminaries for the Sectional Meets.
- Athletes or relay teams may enter a maximum of four events excluding relays at the Sub-Sectional Meet. An athlete may compete in a maximum of four events, including relays at the Sub-Sectional Meet. If an athlete competes in four events in the Sub-Sectional Meet, these four events become the only events that the athlete may compete in at the Sectional Meet.

A-AA State Meet Qualifying Procedures

- A complete description of these procedures can be found in the TSSAA Track and Field Regulations
- 1st and 2nd place competitors from each Sectional and the top two performances from the 3rd and 4th place Sectional finishers shall qualify for the state meet.

* In this example 9 competitors have qualified for the state meet. (Bold Print)

* In the event of a tie for the additional qualifiers, priority is based on placement in the Sectional meet. There was a tie between the 3rd place finishers from the East and Middle, therefore both will advance.

* 4th and 5th place finishers did not qualify even though their height is 7'0". Priority based on placement in the sectional meet.

* It is very important to break ties for placement at the sectional meets.

Division II State Meet Qualifying Procedures

- A complete description of these qualifying procedures can be found in the TSSAA Track and Field Regulations
- 1st place competitors or relay teams from the East Regional shall advance to the state meet. 1st and 2nd place competitors or relay teams from the Middle Regional and West Regional shall advance to the state meet.
- The top three performances from the 2nd through 4th place finishers in the East Region and the 3rd through 5th place finishers in the Middle and West Regions shall qualify for the state meet.

2012 TRACK & FIELD RULES CHANGES:

- 3-4-2** The referee's authority begins upon arrival at the meet site and concludes 30 minutes after the last event results have been announced or made official. The referee retains clerical authority over the contest through the completion of any reports, including those imposing disqualification that are responsive to actions occurring while the referee has jurisdiction. State associations may intercede in the event of unusual incidents after the referee's jurisdiction has ended or in the event that contest is terminated prior to the conclusion of regulation play.
- 4-3-1b(8),
4-3-1c(7),
9-6-1b(7),
9-6-1c(7)** A visible garment worn under the uniform top and/or bottom displaying contrasting/different color stitching to the single, solid color of the undergarment and which functions as the actual seam for the undergarment's construction is legal.

- 4-3-3 PEN
9-6-3 PEN** For the first violation, the competitor shall be required to remove the jewelry before further competition and be issued a warning that a subsequent violation shall result in a disqualification from the event. The referee shall be notified of the violation by the observing meet official and he/she shall notify the coach of the offending school of the competitor's violation and the warning.
- 5-7-3** The starting command for individual races, or opening relay legs of 800 meters or more outdoors and 600 meters or more indoors, shall be to instruct all competitors to take a position three meters behind the starting line or dashed arc behind the line. With the command "on your marks," all competitors will step to the starting line without delay. When all competitors are steady, the starter shall fire the starting device.

7-5-17** When the number of entries dictates, the games committee may assign competitors to flights of no less than five competitors for preliminary competition or may conduct the event in continuous flights. In continuing flights, the first five competitors as determined by the games committee constitute a flight. As a competitor clears the bar, passes a turn at the height or is eliminated, the next competitor in order will be moved up so that the number of competitors in the active flight will be constant.
- 7-5-2** The vaulting pole may be of any material and of any length and diameter. It may have a binding of layers of adhesive tape of uniform thickness on the grip end. However, the plant end of the pole may be protected by layers of tape, PVC, sponge rubber or other suitable material to protect the pole when placed in the planting box.
- 7-5-25
7-5-29 new i** No person shall be allowed to touch the vaulting pole except the pole may be caught by an assigned official, designated pole catcher or the competitor, when circumstances warrant, but never to prevent the pole from dislodging the crossbar, which would result in a foul.
- 9-1-1** The cross country run shall be a course 2500 to 5000 meters (1.5 to 3.1 miles) in length as determined by the meet director or games committee. Measurements shall be along the shortest possible route a runner may take.

Computerized transponders may be used to record the finish of a runner in cross country. A bib transponder or two transponders per runner, one attached to each shoe, must be used. When transponders are used, the official order of finish for runners is that recorded by the transponder, torso for bib transponder and foot for chips.

Please note that sanctioned activities are activities that comply with all TSSAA rules and regulations and the TSSAA Catastrophic Insurance Coverage is extended for those activities only.

In addition, member schools have the option of purchasing Excess Medical Catastrophic Insurance (all benefits mirror the TSSAA Plan) that will provide coverage for students and/or student athletes participating in school sanctioned activities that are not covered by the TSSAA Catastrophic Insurance Policy, i.e. interscholastic sports not sanctioned by the TSSAA, intramural sports, open gym, off season conditioning, summer camps/clinics, field trips and other normal school activities including travel to and from (please see brochure).

When Athletes and Coaches are Covered:

1. Participating in a TSSAA sanctioned sport during the time outlined in the TSSAA Calendar
2. Weight lifting and conditioning – Is only covered during the season when teams are allowed to practice
3. Preseason scrimmages
4. Travel to and from athletic practice and contests, provided the entire team is together with the coach in charge
5. Practice during the school day – Must be practicing as a unit during the time that conforms with the rules, regulations, and season as corresponding athletic practice outside the school day
6. Summer practice – Must be a school team practicing as a unit during the time specified in the TSSAA Sports Calendar with school coach in charge
7. Games/Contests – Athletes and coaches are covered while travelling together and participating in sanctioned TSSAA contests. Athletic Directors are now covered travelling to those contests. Independent travel to and from is not covered (Example: athletes driving to a site and meeting the coach).

When Athletes and Coaches are Not Covered:

1. Open Facilities
2. Weight Training and Conditioning – At no time during the off-season are players and coaches covered.
3. Summer Camps – Any sport team attending camp must have coverage or the camp must cover the athletes and coaches. TSSAA Catastrophic Insurance does not cover team camps.
4. Student-athletes are not covered when they are supervised by a non-approved coach or a coach who has not met coaching requirements.

How to Report a Claim:

1. Fax on school letterhead the following instructions to Loomis & LaPann (518-792-3426):
 - a. Name of injured party
 - b. Name, address, and phone number of injured party’s parents or guardian
 - c. Date of accident or injury
 - d. Brief overview of accident
2. Loomis & LaPann will send claim filing instructions and claim form to injured party’s parents or guardian. It will be the parent’s responsibility to file their claim.
3. Please keep copies to verify you have reported the incident.

5. Please note it is not necessary to report all injuries. The general procedure is to report any injury that may require surgery. Injuries that require surgery will probably penetrate the \$10,000.00 deductible.

TSSAA 2011-2012 SPORTS CALENDAR & DEFINITIONS:

For each sport there shall be a beginning practice date, a date for the first contest, a limit for the number of regular season contests, rules in regard to tournaments where applicable, rules in regard to off-season practice, and rules in regard to summer practice.

They are as follows:

Track and Field (Boys and Girls)

Monday, week of August 1 until completion of 3 weeks (21 consecutive days)	DEAD PERIOD
End of Dead Period until Monday, week of November 1.....	Weight training/conditioning permitted. No open facilities. No practice.
Monday, week of November 1 until completion Of 3 weeks (21 consecutive days).....	Weight lifting/conditioning permitted. No open facilities. No practice.
End of 3 weeks until December 31.....	Weight training/conditioning permitted. No open facilities. No practice.
January 1 until Monday, week of February 15	Weight training/conditioning. Open facilities permitted. No practice.
Monday, week of February 15	First Practice Date. Must practice 3 days before preseason scrimmages. Maximum of 4 preseason scrimmages or 2 preseason scrimmage dates, or 1 date and 2 scrimmages.
Monday, 10 weeks prior to Spring Fling	Date of First Contest. Eligibility and schedule must be filed online.
Maximum number of regular season contests	11 Dates. (Each meet counts as 1 date.)
End of season until completion of school	Coaches may be involved in a coaching capacity with students in their school on non-school teams.
Completion of school until Summer Dead Period	No practice regulations.
Week preceding July 4 and week of July 4	SUMMER DEAD PERIOD
End of Summer Dead Period until Monday, week of August 1	No practice regulations.

Definitions

Practice – Coach and Player(s) together with instruction, teaching, coaching, etc.

Open Facilities – Schools may use school facilities for the students in their building prior to or at the conclusion of the school day. Coaches may serve in a supervisory capacity only. There is no instruction, no teaching, no coaching, etc. Coaches may not participate or play in any manner.

Weight Training/Conditioning – Must be a generic type program that would be beneficial to all students and not sport specific.

Dead Period – No coaching, observing, or contact between coaches and players in sport involved. There is no practice, no open facilities, and no weight training/conditioning.

Preseason Scrimmage – A school cannot practice with or scrimmage another school until both schools have practiced a minimum of three days. A school may have a maximum of 4 preseason scrimmages or 2 preseason scrimmage dates or 1 preseason scrimmage date and 2 preseason scrimmages.

Practice During the School Day – All athletic practice during the regular hours of any school day shall conform to the same rules, regulations, and seasons as corresponding athletic practice outside school.

Tournament – All tournaments shall be held on consecutive days with no other regular season games being played during the tournament unless permission is granted by the Executive Director. A tournament is defined as a competition of three or more teams and three or more games, matches, etc., which progress to determine a winner.

Multiple Contests – In all individual sports (cross country, golf, track and field, and wrestling) individuals accompanied by a coach may enter varsity competition at a different site on the same time and date, and this will not count as two days on the school's schedule.

Beginning Sport – Any school that is starting a sport for the first time may have five days of off-season practice prior to the first season the sport begins. This would apply to girl's volleyball, girl's soccer, soccer, baseball, girl's softball, and track and field. It would not apply to football and basketball since schools are allowed 10 days in the off-season in football and 5 days in the off-season in basketball.

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POLE VAULT CHECK LIST:

Only member schools that are listed below may compete in pole vault competition.

The following schools have been checked and comply with the minimum standards as set forth in the NFHS Track and Field rule book for pole vault landing pads.

If a school is listed it verifies that its equipment meets the minimum standards and pole vault competition can be held at this facility.
